
## ACTIVITIES REPORT DARJEELING GOVT. COLLEGE

### **SESSION 2018-19**

 CAMPUS CLEANING AND ZERO WASTE HIMALAYA- Our session 2018-2019 began with some urgency as College was undergoing assessment under NAAC. Therfore NSS Unit II along with Unit I volunteers worked tirelessly for cleaning and arranging the college compound during the first week of August, 2018, prior to the visit of NAAC peer team. During the same time few active volunteers from the college participated in two days' residential workshop on the theme ZERO WASTE HIMALAYA at Mirik Busty, 4<sup>th</sup>-5<sup>th</sup> August,2018 jointly organised by Zero Waste Himalaya and WWF (Pic 1a-b).

PLASTIC FREE DARJEELING CAMPAIGN- On 9<sup>th</sup> August 2018 both NSS Unit II and Unit I volunteers participated in the event on the theme "PLASTIC FREE DARJEELING" and rallied around the town carrying placards with messages. On next day i.e. 10<sup>th</sup> August,2018 five NSS volunteers from our college gave presentation at St. Josephs' College, Darjeeling on the theme "Growing level of pollution in Darjeeling".

3. <u>VISIT TO AN ORPHANAGE AT RANGBUL</u>- Our first program in the new year began with made a visit to a children home (orphanage) namely Kiwanis Noora Children Home at Rangbull on 2<sup>nd</sup> March,2019. 17 volunteers of both NSS Unit II and Unit I along with Programme officers were there. There volunteers interacted with the children and gave an interactive talk on objectives and activities of NSS, Darjeeling Govt. College. Volunteers also gave inspiring and career oriented messages through poetry, music and dance. Lastly backpack school bags, stationeries and sweets were distributed among the children as donation.

4. <u>FUND RAISING PROGRAMME-</u> On 24<sup>th</sup> March, 2019, volunteers of both NSS unit II and Unit I conducted a huge "Fund raising programme" at Chowrasta, Darjeeling for financially helping a patient named Mrs. Baruna Chettri, a resident of Lower Harsing, Lebong, Darjeeling. She is an accident patient and is suffering from spinal cord injury since long. They approached the NSS, Darjeeling Govt. College and so we conducted the Fund raising programme. We able to collect an amount of Rs. 65,000/- (Rs. Sixty-Five Thousand only) and handed over the same amount to Mrs. Baruna Chettri and her husband in the presence of representatives of their village Samaj on 30<sup>th</sup> March,2019.

5. SPECIAL CAMP AT LATPANCHAR- A Special Camp was organised by NSS Unit II and Unit I at Latpanchar Village 57 kms (approx) away from Darj. Govt. College, for three days (10<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup> March,2019.). This year, the team received immense help and guidance from Mr. Anup Lama, Assistant Teacher, Latpanchar High School. He took all the responsibility of our fooding and lodging arrangements. On the first day (10.03.2019), the morning was devoted to a small hiking in the surrounding forest and Chinchona plantation. This part of Latpanchar forms a part of the upper Mahananda Wildlife Sanctuary. Then after the lunch the volunteers conducted one socio-economic household survey of the village. In the second day (11.03.2019), the volunteers were trekked to the Aahal Dara, famed sunrise point in the early moring. Then after breakfast they were given a visit of Nursery and plantation of Chinchona and other medicinal plants. This visit gave many good insights regarding local economy and rural sustainable lifestyle. On Day three (12.03.2019) the volunteers made a visit to a local primary school

named Magnolia School. The volunteers cleaned the whole school premises along with the small toddlers and indirectly made them aware of significance of cleanliness. The volunteers interacted with the students and took their class too. They made the toddlers participate in various games and activities. The whole school came alive with the games and activities. Lastly the team made donations of various stationary items (White board and markers) and games items (like footballs, cricket bats, Chinese checker, badminton rackets, cricket balls etc) to the school. The names of winners in the games and activities (singing, dancing) were announced and were presented with gifts. Ultimately sweets were distributed among all.

Youth Against Trafficking Club of Darjeeling Government College in collaboration with Mankind in Action for Rural Growth (MARG) Darjeeling was formally formed with an awareness program on human trafficking and child sexual abuse on the 12th of July 2018. In this awareness program in our college, students were provided about the awareness on human

trafficking with various examples from local level. Member of the MARG were present in this programme.





World Day against Trafficking in Persons is observed annually on July 30<sup>th</sup> 2019 and MBKS Trust observed this important day with MARG Darjeeling. MARG assisted and conducted a quiz tilted 'Mukti Quiz' at GDNS Hall for schools and college students alike to spread awareness on trafficking, related legislation and statutes. The students of Darjeeling Government College participated in this programe with full enthesitis. All together seven

schools and six colleges participated in the quiz. Mr. Rahul A. Pradhan, GS, MBKS Trust, was the quizmaster of the day.

The programe was started with seven schools competing for the ever MUKTI QUIZ school level trophy. After gruelling three rounds of hardcore quizzing, the all girls team from Loreto Convent, Darjeeling were crowned the champions with Gyanoday Niketan coming second and Notre Dame Academy third.

In the afternoon session, six colleges competed for the MUKTI QUIZ college level championship. All the teams were outstanding and very few points separated the winner from the rest of the pack. The team from Darjeeling Government College were the champions with Salesian College Sonada coming second and Southfield College third.


